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AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT STATE & LOCAL FUNDING DISBURSEMENTS

Third major COVID-19 relief bill - directly funds state, city, and county governments. Provides resources for government purchases in a highly flexible manner, including for technology needs.

Cities, counties, states and their sub-agencies

PROJECTED FUNDING

\$350 BILLION



STRATEGIES FOR POLICING INNOVATION

This grant program seeks to build upon analysis-driven, evidence-based policing by encouraging state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies to develop effective, economical, and innovative responses including the use of technology.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Cities, counties, and local law enforcement

PROJECTED FUNDING

up to \$700,000 per grantee

COORDINATED TRIBAL ASSISTANCE SOLICITATION

Through Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitations (CTAS) the Department has awarded funding to hundreds of American Indian and Alaska Native communities. The Tribes are using these funds to enhance law enforcement.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Federally-recognized tribal governments

PROJECTED FUNDING

Up to \$1,000,000 per agency

BYRNE/JAG LOCAL ASSISTANCE GRANT

Primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to local jurisdictions - provides units of local governments with critical funding necessary to support a range of program areas including law enforcement technology improvement programs.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Local law enforcement

PROJECTED FUNDING

Formula based on population and crime statistics

BYRNE/JAG STATE ASSISTANCE GRANT

Primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to states - provides state governments with critical funding necessary to support a range of program areas including law enforcement technology improvement programs.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

State governments

PROJECTED FUNDING

Formula based on population and crime statistics.

A portion of funds must be distributed to local governments (varies by state)



STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSGP)

Supports implementation of strategies to address planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. Funds can be used to purchase technology listed on FEMA's Authorized Equipment List.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

State and local governments, with 80% of funds passed through the state to local government needs within 45 days of receipt

PROJECTED FUNDING

\$415 Million allocated to states based on a formula of population and threat assessment, 80% must be reallocated to local governments

DHS URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE (UASI)

Addresses the unique needs, of high-threat, high-density Urban Areas and assists them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. Funds can be used to purchase technology listed on FEMA's Authorized Equipment List.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

~ 3 dozen urban high-threat areas, selected by DHS annually

PROJECTED FUNDING

\$615 million allocated to high threat urban areas based on a threat formula determined by DHS
